TERMS OF REFERENCE (Reviewed by this committee on 21st November 2016)

DELEGATED POWERS TO THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE (added 05/12/16)

The board of governors, at the Main Governing Body Meeting, has granted the Curriculum committee, where applicable, the power to ratify their own policies without the requirement for further ratification at the MGBM.

1. To advise the Governing Body on:
 - ◆ Monitoring and Review of the School Development Plan as delegated by the Main Governing Body
 - ◆ Monitoring and review of the school's delivery of performance targets
 - ◆ The school's Curriculum, structure, teaching styles and assessment procedures
 - ◆ Their statutory obligations under the National Curriculum

2. To review statutory and non-statutory education policies and provision including but not limited to the following:
 - ◆ Collective Worship
 - ◆ Religious Education
 - ◆ Sex Education
 - ◆ Special Educational Needs
 - ◆ Gifted and Talented pupils
 - ◆ Single Equality Policy

Policies relating to the Curriculum Committee may be ratified during a committee meeting with no requirement to be taken to the Main Governing Body Meeting (with the exception of SEN).

The Curriculum Committee meets once per term and has a quorum of three "core" committee members.
